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Membership Comments

- Georgia Historical Records Advisory Council Paragon, one of the 3 prequalified vendors on the GA DOAS statewide contract for recovery services after a disaster, has discontinued its recovery services to cultural/historical clients. Former Paragon representative, Barry Hawkins, attended the Chatham County Hurricane Conference, including the ESF-11C session in the afternoon. He is now with Capital Restoration, and they are interested in providing post-disaster services to NCH institutions and sites. The GA DOAS contract is up for renewal for another year as of 7/1/2016. HRAC will try to be able to report at the July LEPC meeting on whether or not the contract has been renewed, as well as on whether or not Capital Restoration has been pre-qualified as a vendor on that contract.
- Memorial Planning regional exercise with the State which will include health care entities in the region and will occur March 27, 2017 – Regional J Coastal Health Care Coalition – Jimmy Gordon to provide updates.
- CEMA Newsletter (CEMA Signal) with hurricane information has recently been published. Emergency advisory committee has been formed and provides a report card after each meeting – the report card is included in the newsletter.
- Chatham County Health Department Functional medical needs (to provide services during hurricanes) webinar tomorrow. Zika update – primarily being handled by their district office – advising residents to prepare similar to West Nile – prevent standing water, use DEET, wear long sleeves, etc.
- Humane Society Meghan Collins will be new disaster services coordinator.

Sub-Committee Reports

- Training and Exercise Gregg Close Prior Tier II training was successful. Planning a similar seminar for TRI and TSCA training for the last week of June. Should be sending information out to the membership in the next 10 days.
- Steering/By-Laws Committee Tom Dolan Modifications to the by-laws are done.
 They were submitted to the membership for review via email last week. A motion was

- Hurricane Season Readiness Meredith Ley plans are located on CEMA website.

Families should be making plans for where they will go during a hurricane and have an emergency kit. CEMA can also help with business continuity plans.

Chatham County Prepare-A-Thon – Lisa Janak Newman, FEMA

Question from Al Kritter – concerned about Elba Island conversion from an import facility to a manufacturing/export facility. Emergency response plan is not required until the date construction begins. Asks the LEPC to review the present ERP and determine if it meets the LEPC requirements. Dennis – CEMA is not a regulatory agency, however, the existing plan appears to be consistent with other emergency response plans. They have a draft they are currently reviewing. Al indicated that they have submitted a FOIA request but have not received a response. Dennis – have to submit a FERC notification first – this particular plan is FOIA exempt. Al –Citizens for Clean Air and Water meeting May 26 at Candler to discuss the transport of haz mat on DeRenne to service the plant. Meredith – all evacuation routes for Tier 2 companies are available on the CEMA website.
